## German Language and Cultural Studies

6 weeks of intensive German language for beginner, intermediate or advanced

### LOCATION

Technische Universität Carolo-Wilhelmina zu Braunschweig



Braunschweig is a modern urban city in North Central Germany with a current population of 240,000 and a history rich in tradition. During the Middle Ages, Braunschweig was a member of the "Hanseatic League" and ranked as one of the most influential cities of its time: the city's fine Romanesque and Gothic churches and Town Hall still bear witness to this great past. Today, Braunschweig is also a regional center for the arts and cultural heritage. The Technische Universität Braunschweig is, at 250 years, one of the oldest technical universities in Germany. Today, 13,000 students are enrolled in six faculties and 110 institutes.

### PROGRAM DETAILS

The International Summer Program offers six weeks of intensive German language training at the basic, intermediate and advanced level. Students will have 24 hours of instruction in German per week, including 8 hours of cultural studies. Classes start at 8:30am and end at 2:30pm with a one-hour lunch break. You will be taught in small groups of 15-17 students. A tutor will be assigned to you to advise you on both academic and personal matters during the program.

### COURSES AND CREDITS

Four levels of German language classes are offered.

A written and oral placement test on the first day will place students in the appropriate language class. At the intermediate and advanced level you will be able to choose elective classes in addition to your conversation course and cultural studies. Special interest classes include: Writing, Listening Comprehension, Reading, Grammar, Vocabulary Enrichment.

In addition, students will study German culture, history and geography 8 hours per week. The topics of the cultural studies course prepare for and are intertwined with the excursions and field trips included in the course. The course will have a final examination (both written and oral) after which you will be awarded a certificate. If you wish, you can earn credits for the program (9 ECTS).



### HOUSING & MEALS

Single room with families or with German students in fraternities or dormitories. Students receive a meal stipend of EUR200 to purchase inexpensive meals in the university Mensa and Cafeteria.

### EXCURSIONS

Two 2-day weekend excursions to Berlin and Hamburg as well as several day trips and museum visits are included.

### ISEP-EXCHANGE COST

Cost is based on tuition, housing and meals at your home university. \$345 application/placement fee to ISEP.
