## ARGENTINA: Universidad Blas Pascal



### Special Courses Taught in English + Spanish Language for Beginners

Tango into the spirit of Argentine culture while learning Spanish and taking courses taught in English. This program includes airport pick up; a tour of beautiful Córdoba, a thriving historic cultural center ideal for outdoor enthusiasts; excursions to local sites; tango lessons; free access to all campus facilities; and an Argentine "buddy" to acquaint students with the city and campus. In addition to intensive Spanish language lessons, students can choose from a variety of courses: Argentine History through Economic Processes, International Business, Marketing, and Literature and Movies. Sophomores can apply. **Dates: August - November only.**

## CHILE: Pontificia Universidad Católica de Valparaíso



### Culture Courses Taught in English + Spanish Language for Beginners

Experience Chile's vibrant Valparaíso region and take advantage of beautiful weather, stunning beaches, and the magnificent mountains of the Cordillera de Los Andes. This program offers an intensive beginning Spanish language component and opportunities for exciting excursions. In addition, students choose two of the following culture-based courses taught in English: Contemporary Latin American Literature, Contemporary Latin American Films, Political and Social Change in Chile, Pre-Columbian Arts and Society, Socioeconomic Evolution of Latin America and Chile, and International Relations. Sophomores can apply. **Dates: July - December; March - June.**

## CHILE: Pontificia Universidad Católica de Valparaíso



### Contemporary Latin American Studies for Advanced Speakers of Spanish

Enjoy the diverse landscapes and warm hospitality of Chile while exploring contemporary Latin America from a multidisciplinary perspective. All courses are taught in Spanish and in addition to three exciting core program courses—Contemporary Latin American History, Contemporary Latin American Narrative, and Globalization and Integration in Latin America—participants can choose from an array of electives, including the Regional Geography of Valparaíso, to be taken alongside local Chilean students. **Dates: July - December only.**

## NICARAGUA: Universidad Americana de Managua (UAM)



### Regular University Courses in English or Spanish plus Spanish Language Class

Dive into the unique culture of Nicaragua, live and learn in its bustling capital, and be dazzled by untouched landscapes that range from pristine beaches to lush rainforests. This program includes service learning and internship opportunities as well as host family stays and once-daily round-trip transportation to the university. UAM offers courses in humanities, social sciences, architecture, engineering, medicine, and dentistry in Spanish. It also offers degree programs through the College of University Studies in English (CUSE), an American-style English Language College within the university, that offers multiple programs within the School of Business Administration and of Sciences and Humanities. **Dates: August - December; February - June.**

## ARGENTINA: Universidad del Salvador



### Intensive Spanish Language Summer Program

Spend four weeks studying intensive Spanish in the lively capital of Argentina, a vibrant nation with a cultural blend of European and American traditions that form a heritage all its own. Sample world-famous steaks and enjoy the urban lifestyle of Buenos Aires, a city that continuously celebrates its vibrant traditions and expansive growth. Student activities include a city tour and visits to acclaimed museums, *porteño* suburbs, cinemas, theaters, and tango shows. Students on this summer language program offered by Universidad del Salvador will develop and strengthen their Spanish communication skills while taking advantage of several field trips focusing on the history, culture, and people of Argentina. Classes are small, personalized, and offered from the beginning to advanced levels.

## COSTA RICA: Universidad Nacional



### Spanish Language and Costa Rican Culture Summer Program

Spend six weeks exploring the culture and language of beautiful Costa Rica, known for its rich rainforests, environmental conservation, and ecological awareness. With democratic institutions and no standing national army, it is politically stable and serves as a worldwide eco-tourism center. Universidad Nacional—surrounded by coffee farms and only 20 minutes from the thriving capital city, San José—offers this cultural immersion language program for students at all levels. Students live with host families and participate in exciting day-long excursions as well as cultural workshops that include Costa Rican cooking, dance, and mask-making. Also included in the benefits are an airport pick up, airport drop off, and on-site orientation. *Pura Vida!*

## SPAIN: Universidad de Almería



### Spanish Language, Culture, and Business Summer Program

From Moorish castles to cutting-edge architecture, Spain is a modern country that celebrates its rich and diverse history. The Almería province, which receives the most sunshine and least rainfall in all of Europe, has beautiful beaches, natural parks, and an array of interesting villages to visit. Students can improve their Spanish through a combination of classroom instruction and excursions throughout southern Spain. Students will visit such sites as the Alhambra in Granada, Cabo de Gata Natural Park, and several landmarks in Almería. In addition to daily language classes and elective courses such as Spanish Literature, Spanish Society and Reality, Spanish for Business, and Spanish History and Culture. Instructionally related fieldtrips count toward students' total credit hours.
