Surrounded by 17,000 acres of university farms and woodlands devoted to research, the 1,400 acre campus is situated in the small city of Clemson (pop. 10,000); the nearby main street is lined with restaurants, pubs and shops. Clemson is in the east of the USA, approximately 2 hours from both Atlanta, Georgia and Charlotte, North Carolina, and 30 minutes west of Greenville, South Carolina.

Within a hundred mile radius can be found the Coeur d'Alene and Nez Perce Indian reservations, Schweitzer and Silver Mountain ski resorts, Coeur d'Alene Lake and Dworshak Reservoir, the Clearwater and Snake rivers, Bitterroot Mountains, Palouse Falls and Hell's Canyon. The university campus and adjacent farms cover nearly 800 acres. Sporting facilities include an indoor football field, two swimming pools, track, basketball and tennis courts, 18-hole golf course, and an outdoor programs center with equipment for mountaineering, skiing, kayaking, rafting, camping, and hiking.

The city enjoys a reputation as the horse capital of the world. Lexington hosts a philharmonic orchestra, ballet and opera house. The university has an anthropology museum, art museum, art galleries and a center for the arts. Research centers are established in aging, Appalachian studies, biomedical engineering, business and economics, equine research, human development, mining and minerals, robotics, tobacco and health issues, toxicology, transportation, and water resources.

In addition to outdoor recreation possibilities, the city is known as an active cultural and health care center, as well as a hub of the timber industry. The 200-acre university campus is bordered by the Clark Fork River and Mount Sentinel. Special centers include the Institute for Tourism and Recreation Research, the Montana Forest and Conservation Experiment Station, the Environmental Science Laboratory, and the Wilderness Institute.</p>

Vermont is known for changing seasons, autumn being particularly beautiful. Burlington is just 90 miles from Montreal, Canada, 200 miles from Boston, and 300 miles from New York City. The university has extensive indoor and outdoor recreational facilities, a multi-purpose student center, a music recital hall, and a theater.</p>

The picturesque location in a fertile valley surrounded by mountains creates ideal opportunities for recreational activities such as skiing, snow boarding, hiking, mountain biking, rock climbing, and kayaking in Logan Canyon. The canyon entrance is 10 minutes from the Utah State campus. Logan is home to the Utah Festival Summer Opera, Lyric and Ellen Eccles Theaters, and the Jensen Historical Farm. Other nearby activities include swimming and boating at Bear Lake, and canoeing and bird-watching on the Bear River. Logan is mid-way between Yellowstone National Park to the north, and the five national parks in Utah to the south, such as Arches and Zion Parks.</p>

The university is a major cultural center for the region. The university grounds include an airport, farm, experimental plots and orchards, and about 600 acres of adjoining agricultural research land. Athletic facilities include a coliseum, a stadium, a field house, gymnasium, and various playing fields. A student center offers a variety of services and recreational opportunities. Research facilities include the Virginia Center for Coal and Energy Research, the Virginia Water Resources Research Center, and University Centers for Environmental Studies and Industry Research.</p>
