Location: The University of Marburg

The University of Marburg is one of the oldest German universities. In 1527, as part of the Reformation, 23-year-old Landgrave Philipp the Magnanimous founded the university as the first Protestant university. With about 19,600 students and 7,500 staff members, it is one of Germany's medium-sized universities.



Program Details

Seminars are taught in German or English in the following areas of study: Political Science, Economics, and Cultural Studies. Each seminar (18 hours) lasts two weeks. You can enroll in up to four seminars. You can choose to enroll only in English classes, only in German classes, or in German and English classes out of one module. Two seminars of your choice are covered in addition to the German language course by the program fee of the standard program.

Courses and Credits

Upon successful completion of the courses you will be awarded the following ECTS points (European Credit Transfer System) by the University of Marburg:

The German language course is offered at three different levels (basic, intermediate, upper level) and taught in small groups (no more than 15) by highly qualified instructors of German. In order to determine which group is best for each student, a short oral and written language test will be given on the first day of classes. You can be certain that you will be placed in a language course which is neither too difficult nor too easy for you.

For each Seminar (18 hrs.):	3.0 ECTS-Points
For the German language course (36 hrs.):	3.0 ECTS-Points
